Teresa Sanchez Cepeda Davila y Ahumada was born in the Castilian city of Ávila in 1515, the third child in a family descended from Jewish merchants. She experienced many profound hardships, including the loss of her mother at age 14. She also suffered through many debilitating illnesses and physical pain, nurturing a life of deep contemplative prayer.

She was the first female "Doctor of the Catholic Church", the first woman in the History of the Catholic Church to receive such an honor and received the honor in 1970 by Pope Paul VI. Some foods (may differ by denomination or region)
